Find an empty plastic container. Can you fill it up with water? Pour half of the water away? Can you make the container be a quarter full?



# Maths treasure 2 Search for numbers! Where can you see numbers in your house? What do the numbers show?





## Treasure tips to remember!

2 halves = a whole 4 quarters = a whole

I represents litre ml represents millilitres 1 litre = 1000 ml ½ litre = 500 ml

Cm represents centimetre 100 cm = 1 metrem represents 1 metre
