#### Introduction

Listen to Mr Wilkinson read 'Zog'. If you have the book at home, you could read it yourself, or ask a grown-up to read it with you.

Julia Donaldson (who wrote Zog) uses a lot of rhyme in her books. Rhyme is where the end sound or sounds in a word sound like those in another word (for example, shed and bed).

What rhymes can you find in Zog?

Today, we are going to look at rhyming strings. This is where we put lots of words that rhyme together and see who can make the longest string.

For example:

Shed - bed - head - dread - led - red - said - bread - dead - fed

Pick one or more of these words – what's the longest rhyming string you can make?

ago	star	flew	tree
care	stay	roar	knight
