Vocabulary

- Blues-a style- a style of music characterised by its harmonic structure.
- ► Latin Fusion music from South America. Full of catchy rhythms.
- ► Pulse- the regular heartbeat of the music
- Rhythm- long and short sounds that happen over the pulse
- Pitch-high and low sounds
- ► Compose- create and develop music
- ► Improvise-to make up a tune and play it on the spot
- → Perform singing and playing for others to hear
- Groove-the rhythmic part of music that makes you want to move and dance
- ₩ Keyboard- electric instrument played like a piano
- ► Bass Lowest part of the music
- Bottom Over Music often uses lots of percussion without other parts
- ► Balance all parts can be heard clearly in the music
- ► Vocals singing parts, lead or backing singers

To know that music has a steady pulse like a heartbeat. To know we can create rhythms from our words, names etc

Timbre, Texture, Structure & Appropriate Musical Notation.

- Singing & Playing Tuned & Un-tuned Instruments.
 - To confidently sing or rap 5 songs from memory and sing them in unison

To know that unison is everyone singing at the same time.

- To know the names of notes in their instrumental part from memory.
- To know the names of the instruments they are playing.
- To know about voices, singing notes of different pitches.
- To know you can make different types of sound you're your voice.
- To know when to start and stop singing when following a leader.

Improvise, Compose and Perform

- To know improvisation is about making up your own songs.
- To know that composing is like writing your own story with music.
- To help create a simple melody using one, two or three notes
- To know that a performance is sharing music with other people.
