Vocabulary

amphibian	Amphibians live in water as babies and on land as they grow. They have smooth, slimy skin.				
bird	All birds have a beak, two legs, feathers and wings.				
fish	Fish live and breathe underwater. They have scaly skin, fins to help swim and breathe through gills.				
mammal	Mammals are animals that breathe air, have fur or hair and feed on their mother's milk as a baby.				
reptile	All reptiles breathe air. They have scaly skin.				
carnivore	Animals that mainly eat other animals (meat) are Carnivores.				
herbivore	Animals that only eat plants are Herbivores.				
smnivore	Animals that eat a mix of plants and meat are Omnivores.				

Facts

- → We have five senses:
 - → Sight your eyes let you see all the things around you.
 - Hearing your ears listen to the things around you. Your brain is able to tell what different smells are.
 - Smell you smell using your nose.
 - → Touch your skin gives you your sense of touch. You are able to tell if something is hot, cold, rough or smooth without looking at it.
 - Taste your sense of taste comes from your tongue. You can tell if something tastes bitter or sweet. You might have some tastes that you like and some you don't.
