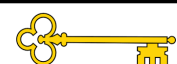

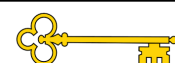

Vocabulary

media	The materials and tools used by an artist.
line	A mark made by a drawing tool or brush.
tone	How light or dark something is.
texture	How something feels.
tools	Something used to create artwork.
techniques	The different skills used to create art.
scale	The size of something
Primary colours	The 3 colours (red, blue, yellow) used to make other colours.



Skills

Drawing

- I can use a range of different media with control.
- Line- I can control the lines I make.
- Tone- I can make light and dark lines and patterns by using and selecting different media.
- Texture- I can investigate and discuss a range of textures.
- Shape- I can draw shapes from observations and memory.

Painting

- I can use a range of tools and techniques.
- I can work on different scales.
- I can mix primary shades and create new colours.
- I can choose different colours for a purpose.
- I can use different types of paint.
- I can try different printing techniques.

Artists

- Find out about a range of artists, craft makers and designers.
- Copy the artwork of other artists.
- Look at the natural world.
