carving	To scrape or cut off

Skills

- To use a range of materials creatively to design and make products.
- To use sculpture to develop and share ideas, experiences and imagination.
- Practise techniques using a range of malleable media e.g. salt dough, plasticine, soap, before using clay.
- Use rolling and shaping to create basic shapes.
- Impress and apply simple decoration techniques, including simple carving and painting.
- Use tools and equipment safely and in the correct way.
