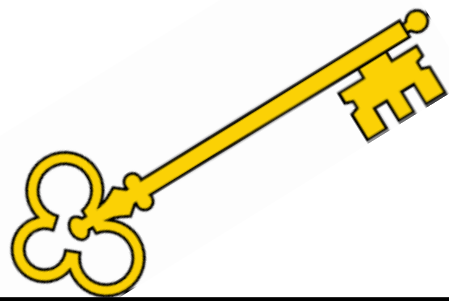


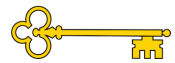

Blurb and Main Themes

Christina Rossetti was one of the most important poets of the Victorian age.

‘The Wind’ is a two-stanza poem. Through barely altered wording and perfect verb choice, Rossetti states this idea in only eight lines and invites the reader to journey with her through her thought process in a way that is fitting. We all, in the end, can relate to being impacted by something that is unperceivable.

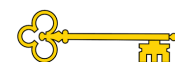

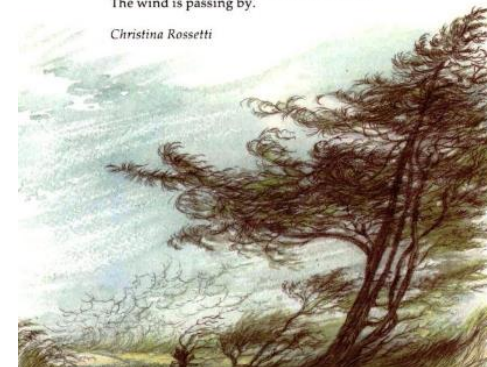
