Vocabulary

composition	How the parts of an artwork are arranged
tone	The lightness or darkness of something
observations	Looking closely at something
Colour spectrum	The colours of the rainbow
tints	Lightening a colour with white
shade	Adding black to make a colour darker
Secondary colours	Colours made by mixing the primary colours together

Skills

Drawing

- I can explore lines, waves, composition and colour.
- I can continue to investigate tone by drawing light/dark lines, light/dark patterns, light/dark shapes using a pencil.
- I can draw lines/marks from observations.

Painting

- I will have more control over mark making.
- I understand the colour wheel and colour spectrums.
- I am able to mix all the secondary colours using primary colours confidently.
- I understand how to make tints using white and tones.
- I can use a suitable brush to produce marks appropriate to work. E.g. small brush for small marks.

Artists

- Find out about a range of artists, craft makers and designers.
- Copy the artwork of other artists.
- Look at the natural world.
