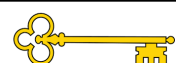

Vocabulary

sculpture	3 dimensional artwork
malleable media	Clay, plasticine and salt dough can all be changed in shape by hand or tools
moulding	Make something fit a particular shape eg by wrapping round a tube
shaping	Using tools or hand to create a 3D form
impress	Make marks in malleable media using tools, or by hand
carving	To scrape or cut off
pulling	To stretch into shape
pinching	To squeeze into shape



Skills

- To use a range of materials creatively to design and make products. To use sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination.
- Practise techniques using a range of malleable media e.g. salt dough, plasticine, soap, before using clay.
- Manipulate designs using rolling and moulding (pulling, pinching)
- Explore carving into clay using simple tools.
- Create realistic or imagined forms by pulling
- Use tools and equipment safely and in the correct way.
