# Skills

- · Practise techniques using a range of malleable media e.g. salt dough, plasticine, soap, before using clay.
- · Manipulate designs using rolling and moulding (pulling, pinching)
- · Explore carving into clay using simple tools.
- · Create realistic or imagined forms by pulling
- · Use tools and equipment safely and in the correct way.
