- Creating adverbs by adding ly when the root word ends in y and has more than one syllable (happily, angrily, lazily, busily, easily, greedily, messily, wearily, cheekily, clumsily)
- Creating adverbs by adding ly when the root word ends in le. (gently, simply, humbly, nobly, horrible, terribly, possibly, incredibly comfortably, probably)

- \rightarrow show don't tell how the characters are feeling
- → a suspenseful rescue
- → the characters are safe in the end but have to suffer the consequences of their actions and get told off.
