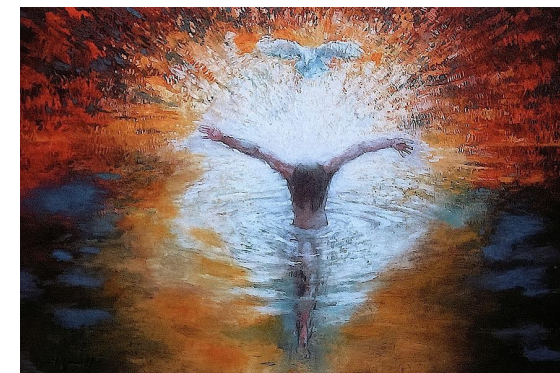

Facts

- Water is used as a Christian symbol and is used during baptisms; it is cleansing, life-giving, beautiful, dangerous, still, flowing and reflective.
- Matthew 3:13-17 tells the story of Jesus's baptism. It tells Christians that Heaven opened and he saw the spirit of God looking like a dove. A voice from Heaven said that Jesus was his son and he loved him.
- Famous artists painted their ideas of what Jesus's baptism would have looked like and they showed God in different ways.
- Prayers used in baptisms include 'The Father, The Son and the Holy Spirit', which is called The Trinity.
