- Adding the suffix -ous (Meaning 'full of') dangerous, poisonous, mountainous, joyous, synonymous, hazardous, riotous, perilous, momentous, scandalous
- Adding the suffix -ous (No definitive root word) tremendous, enormous, jealous, serious, hideous, fabulous, curious, anxious, obvious, gorgeous
- Adding the suffix -ous (words ending in 'y' become 'i' and words ending in 'our' become 'or') various, furious, glorious, victorious, mysterious, humorous, glamorous, vigorous, odorous, rigorous
