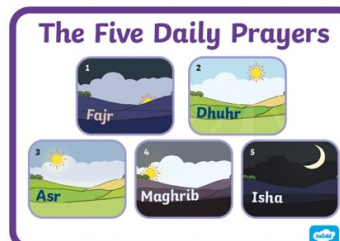

3. Asr: in the late afternoon.

4. Maghrib: after sunset.

5. Isha: at night time.



Facts

- Islam is founded on Five Pillars; faith, prayer, fasting, charitable giving and pilgrimage.
- The first chapter of the Qur'an tells Muslims what God is like. There are five names used for God in this chapter.
- Salah is the name for the five prayers a day; Salat al-fajr: the dawn or any time before sunrise, Salat al-zuhr: midday, after the sun passes its highest, Salat al-'asr: the late part of the afternoon, Salat al-maghrib: dusk or just after sunset, Salat al-'isha: between sunset and midnight.
- Muslims demonstrate self-control by fasting during the month of Ramadan.
- The Night of Power-Laylat-ul-Qadr-is celebrated during the last ten days of Ramadan to mark the giving of the Qur'an.
- Muslims celebrate Eid-ul-Fitr at the end of Ramadan.
